

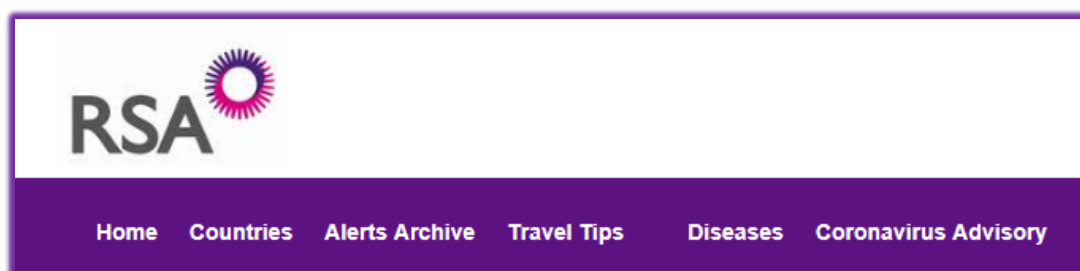

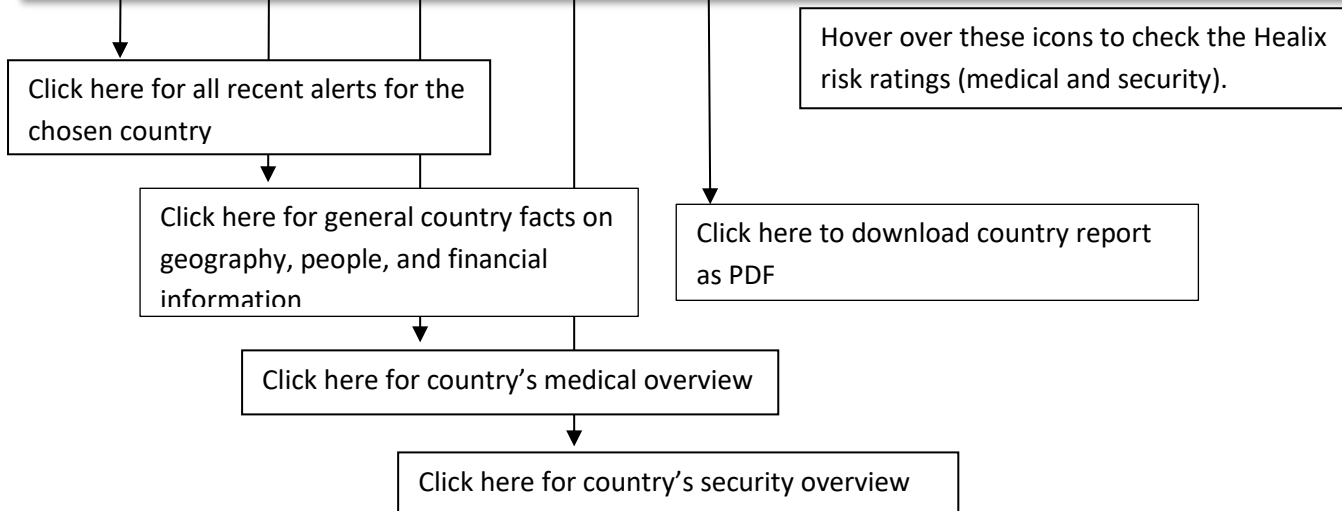

Neuquen: Anticipate and prepare for aftershocks following M5.7 earthquake on 28th April

Argentina – April 29, 2021

Neuquen: Anticipate and prepare for aftershocks following M5.7 earthquake on 28th April. Travellers in Neuquen should anticipate and prepare for aftershocks following a magnitude 5.7 earthquake that struck on 28th April at around 23h17 (local time). The earthquake occurred at a depth of around 84.9miles (136.7km) approximately 8.6miles (14km) south-west of Andacollo. There are currently no initial reports of damage or casualties. Travellers should not enter weakened or damaged structures. If aftershocks occur, adopt the 'Drop, Cover, and Hold' position to mitigate the risk of injury.





First starting around the remote town of Bikoro, one case of Ebola has recently been identified from the city of Mbandaka – which has a population of over one million people. Fears abound that even though Ebola requires close contact to be transmitted, in such a populated city many further cases may occur. In fact, the WHO will meet tomorrow to determine whether a 'Public Health Emergency of International Concern' should be announced. Such a declaration during the large West African Epidemic of Ebola, allowed for increased global support, without doubt foreshortening the outbreak. Lists of contacts of each Ebola patient, and contacts of the contacts, are now being established. These individuals will not only be tested for the virus but may well receive the recently developed Ebola vaccine M27-7520V, otherwise known as V920.
